HOW THE COMPETITION WORKS Each spring, The Dallas Morning News solicits nominations for the Top 100 Places to Work competition. A third-party research partner, Energage LLC, distributes a survey to participating employers. The worker statements from Energage's survey are used to determine the Top Workplaces winners.
